When the EU decides that they need a new country for safety they are called refugees.

Migrants are people who live out of their country for more than 1 year.

It is important to understand their culture (way of life) and their personalities (what a person is like).

It is also important to consider their religion.

## Young People with Disabilities

Disability can be many things.

Some are caused by the body, and some caused by the mind.

For the body, people who have a disability sometimes need help to do physical things, like access a room.

Some physical disabilities include problems with hearing, sight or movement.

It is important to ask them what they need to help them.

For the mind, people who have a disability sometimes need things to be different for them to understand.

Some include disabilities with ADHD or Autism.
